J. UNION STATION Larimer Square

Union Station

A historic transportation hub transformed into a vibrant gathering space, Union Station features boutiques, bars, and restaurants within a beautifully restored Beaux-Arts building. It's both a travel gateway and social hotspot in the heart of LoDo.

2 Larimer Square

Denver's oldest block, Larimer Square blends Victorian architecture with a lively mix of dining, shopping, and nightlife. It's especially charming at night under its iconic string lights.



Built in 1910, this former department store clock tower was once the tallest building west of the Mississippi. It remains a beloved downtown landmark and offers panoramic city views.

4 Denver Museum of Contemporary Art (MCA)

MCA Denver showcases cutting-edge art by regional, national, and international artists. Its minimalist building is a cultural anchor for modern creativity in the city.





Oxford Hotel

Opened in 1891, the Oxford Hotel is Denver's oldest boutique hotel, known for its timeless elegance and storied past. It's located just steps from Union Station in the vibrant LoDo district.

6 Market Station


A redeveloped historic block, Market Station combines modern retail, dining, and residential spaces in a walkable, transit-connected environment. It's a new cornerstone of downtown lifestyle.

Dairy Block

Once home to a historic dairy, this micro-district now blends art, artisan shops, restaurants, and a boutique hotel. Its playful alleyway and milk-can statue make it uniquely memorable.

P Coors Field

Home to the Colorado Rockies, Coors Field is a classic brick ballpark with stunning views of the Rocky Mountains. Its location in LoDo makes it perfect for pre- and post-game fun.





Museum of Illusions

This interactive museum offers a fun, mind-bending experience with optical illusions and immersive exhibits. It's a family-friendly attraction full of photo-worthy surprises.

10 Performing Arts Complex

One of the largest performing arts centers in the U.S., this complex hosts Broadway shows, opera, symphony, and ballet. Its iconic glass galleria connects multiple world-class venues.



111 Denver Pavilions

An open-air shopping and entertainment complex on the 16th Street Mall, Denver Pavilions houses restaurants, shops, a movie theater, and vibrant nightlife. It's ideal for casual downtown fun.

Denver Convention Center

This massive facility hosts conventions, trade shows, and public events, easily identified by the iconic blue bear sculpture peering into its windows. It's a hub for business and culture alike.

Auraria Campus

A shared campus for three major institutions—CU Denver, MSU Denver, and CCD—Auraria is a bustling academic center just steps from downtown. It features green spaces, historic buildings, and student energy.



14 U.S. Mint

One of only four U.S. Mint facilities, the Denver Mint produces billions of coins annually. Free tours offer a behind-the-scenes look at American currency manufacturing.



15 Denver Art Museum

Known for its striking modern architecture and extensive collections, the Denver Art Museum houses art from around the world. Highlights include Indigenous American works and rotating exhibitions.

Modeled after the U.S. Capitol and topped with a real gold dome, the State Capitol offers free tours and stunning views from its dome. Its steps mark exactly one mile above sea level.

Elitch Gardens is a seasonal amusement and water park with roller coasters, family rides, and water slides, all set in the city center. It's a rare urban theme park experience.
